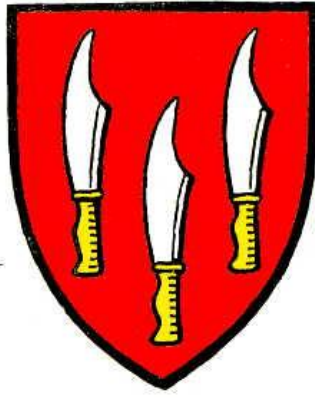



THIS IS MY BLOOD OF THE NEW COVENANT

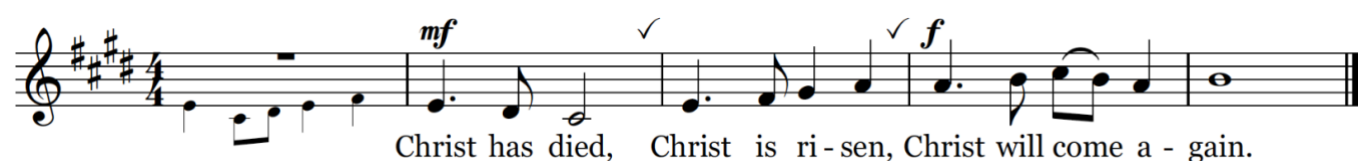

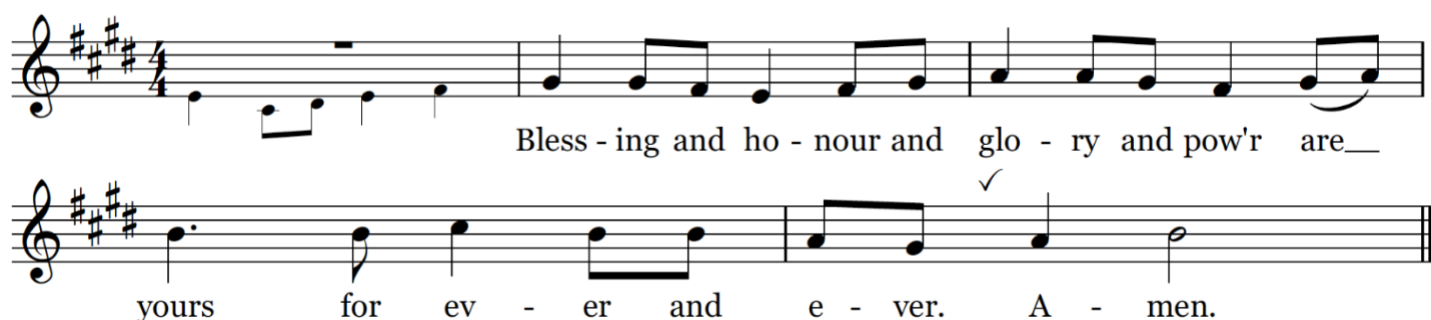
