#### MUSIC PROGRAM NOTES

#### **Communion Motet**

# J.S. Bach BWV 106 (3b) – from his Cantata "Gottes Zeit ist die allerbeste Zeit" Sung by Lisha Ooi

A fortnight ago Lisha sang the first part of this portion of the third movement from this Cantata (roughly translated as "God's Time is the Very Best Time"). The Cantata was written in 1708 (first published 1768) when Bach was just 22 years old. It is sometimes referred to under the different title "Actus Tragicus" - the entire Cantata was intended to be performed as one continuous piece of music probably because it was written for a funeral. Bach scored the work for four vocal parts and a small ensemble of Baroque instruments comprising two recorders, two violas da gamba and continuo. It. Once again today we perform the aria with simply Voice and piano, befitting the simplicity required of the Lenten season. Today Lisha will sing a re-arrangement of the bass and alto duet BWV106(3b) entitled "Mit Fried" und Freud'ich fahr' dahin" ("In peace and joy I pass away"). Bach took this line from Martin Luther's hymn "Mit Fried und Freud" (1524) which basically comprises what we know as the Nunc Dimittis. The accompanying bass line (which you won't be hearing sung today) is based on Luke 23:43 (And Jesus said unto him, "verily I say unto thee, today shalt thou be with me in paradise"): so it's good to imagine these two lines being sung together to get a true sense of Bach's original structure. To assist this process, Lisha will sing the aria once in German with Bach's accompaniment on piano and she will then repeat the aria in English under which I will feature the sung bass line on piano as a countermelody with simpler accompaniment. In most of Bach's chorale preludes, he liked to use a familiar hymn tune as the cantus firmus and then compose countermelodies and accompaniment around that central theme by way of both improvisation and development. You will often find these chorale preludes when played on the organ featuring the melody (cantus firmus) on one manual with a solo stop (e.g. oboe) while Bach's improvisations are left to the second manual and pedals.

The cantata ranks among Bach's most important works. The Bach scholar Alfred Dürr called the cantata "a work of genius such as even great masters seldom achieve".

One point of interest – the Cantata was written in the key of E flat (even though the key signature only uses two flats it's arguable from the abundant use of A flats in the piece that the underlying key is E flat) but when first performed it was realized that this key required certain notes to be played beneath the playable range of the recorder! Quite an oversight! So the entire Cantata was immediately transposed up to F major. This suited the alto who has to grapple with some very low notes in E flat but didn't suit the bass who, in turn, had to deal with some very high notes. All because of a couple of recorders! Thankfully common sense prevailed and the Cantata is now almost universally performed in its original key of E flat (with one very happy bass and one less-then-happy alto) and the recorder parts are adjusted to suit. Or just avoided altogether.

for wisdom, discernment and compassion



# ST BART'S VICARAGE RENOVATION APPEAL


