This is one of eight preludes and fugues formerly attributed to JS Bach, however scientific examination of the manuscripts by Alfred Durr in 1987 and subsequent style analysis of the score by Peter Williams have suggested that the works might have been composed by one of his pupils, Johann Ludwig Krebs. However various possible composers have been suggested, including Johann Tobias Krebs, Wilhelm Friedemann Bach, Franz Anton Maichelbeck, Johann Caspar Simon and the Bohemian composer Johann Kaspar Ferdinand Fischer.

STATUTORY PARISH MEETING – SUNDAY, 12 June @ 12.15pm

Today's Icon: The Descent of the Holy Spirit

The icon shown on the cover of today's Worship Bulletin is a Russian icon painted towards the end of the fifteenth century, known as the 'The Descent of the Holy Spirit'. As with all icons of the Eastern Orthodox Church, the Pentecost icon teaches theology and brings us into the reality of the event depicted. Here are some reflections on the symbolism and meaning of this icon.

The position of the figures represents harmony in which no apostle is depicted as being better than another. The inverse perspective presents the apostles who are near the back of the semicircle from being painted as smaller, which would happen in the rendering of most paintings. They are shown slightly larger particularly Peter and Paul as the chief apostles. Yet even then they are among equals. Of course, Paul was not present during this event, but the reality of Pentecost transcends time and space, and Paul was later joined to this moment, but in a mystical sense. His inclusion shows that he was in complete harmony with the other apostles. The four evangelists hold books and the remainder hold scrolls. The books symbolize the writings of the four gospels and the scrolls show that even those who did not write gospels still proclaimed the gospel message to the world.

There is no discord or chaos. The quietude in this icon stands in contrast to the Pentecost story itself. In Acts 2:1-13 we read about a sudden sound from heaven, a violent wind, tongues of fire, words spoken in different languages, and of bewilderment and amazement. There is nothing shown in this icon that resembles these aspects: no sounds, no words, no speaking disciples, no excited crowd. What we do see is complete tranquillity, of harmony and order. So, has the iconographer forgotten what took place? It is the deeper meaning of Pentecost that he wanted to express. This icon is less an illustration of a biblical narrative than a theological truth.

Why is the head of the semicircle of apostles empty? This is because it is the seat of Jesus who is invisibly present. Jesus said before he ascended into heaven, that he is with us until the end of time. And we know that Jesus continues to keep that promise being invisibly present in the church, guiding us through the Holy Spirit.

At the top of the icon are twelve rays coming from the mandorla (the semicircle) which represent the Holy Spirit coming down upon all of those depicted. The twelve rays symbolize that there is a diversity of gifts given by the one Spirit of God. In the same way, each of the twelve apostles are seated in slightly separate ways: they are not looking at each other or collaborating with each other. It is not their common psychological make-up that unites them. All are different. From the gospel stories we are told that these men have not come together because of their compatibility. The iconographer has given each apostle an individuality with their hair, eyes, movements of their heads, and gestures.

What does bind them together in unity are the rays of the Spirit descending on them from above. Thus, the spirit has opened their hearts to understand the word they have received from Jesus as a common gift received as a common task that binds them together in a community of faith. In other words, the mystery of the church is shown convincingly in this icon – that the church is unity in diversity.

The king-like figure standing at the bottom of this icon is often named 'Cosmos', representing the peoples of the world and is aged to show the corruptibility of the world. He is sitting 'in darkness and the shadow of death' (Luke 1-79). The elegant Pentecost scene appears violated by such ugliness. However, after carefully reading various commentaries, particularly by Leonid Ouspensky (1982) and Nouwen (2007), I understand why this image needed to be in this icon. As Nouwen (2007) explains, 'Pentecost is not the beautiful end of the salvation story, but the beginning of a mission to go out into the world, make disciples of all nations, baptize them ... [and] observe all the commands that Jesus gave us (Matthew 28: 19-20).

Ouspensky writes that this icon is 'an image of the inner life of the Church'. It shows that Christ sits at the head of our church, invisibly guiding us; we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit; we celebrate our own participation in Pentecost through baptism and the liturgies of the church because these transcend time and space; while we always work toward harmony and unity with one another, we have a diversity of gifts and talents; people of all nations and languages are united together in the spiritual building of the church that transforms us from being earthly creatures to heavenly ones.
