





SERMON Dr Muriel Porter

THE NICENE-CONSTANTINOPLE CREED

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church. We believe in one God. the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the \blacksquare life of the world to come. ST BART'S VICARAGE RENOVATION APPEAL



The last major capital expenditure on St Bart's Vicarage was in 1990, some thirty-two years ago. That work has proven long lasting in conjunction with some updating of areas in the house over the past 10 years, including: a new kitchen, areas with new flooring, renovated ensuite shower, new carport, paving, and new back garden. There are now other areas of the house that require attention to maintain

a reasonable living standard, including: a new family bathroom, new flooring, back veranda work, and a complete interior redecorating. We won't be able to achieve it all at once, but we do need to get the major items fixed as a matter of urgency so to house an additional priest in 2023. Parish Council Report to the Parish – September 2022

The September meeting of St Bart's Parish Council had two major items on the agenda – the forthcoming Parish Annual Meeting and, sadly, the departure of Fr Matthew.

So, the Annual Meeting can be held before we farewell Fr Matthew, it is earlier this year: Sunday 30 October at 11.30am. Because the financial audit will not be complete by then, the meeting will then be adjourned until a brief second session on Sunday 4 December to receive the audited report.

Parish Annual Meetings are governed in close detail by diocesan legislation, so we need to adhere to a careful process. The revision of the electoral roll is now underway, and soon there will be calls for nominations for two churchwardens, an hon. parish secretary, and an hon. parish treasurer. Note that this year, because Fr Matthew has submitted his resignation to the Archbishop, there will no election of parish members of the Incumbency Committee. The members elected and appointed last year – Don Heath, Kim Ricketts and the churchwardens' nominee, Helen McDonald – remain in place. The Incumbency process will get underway when it is initiated by our regional bishop, Bishop Genieve.

Parish Council discussed a number of transition areas to be managed, and also agreed that Fr Matthew's farewell service will be held on Sunday 6 November at 3pm, with refreshments to follow. Holding the service in the afternoon will allow many of his friends and colleagues around the diocese to join the parish for this important occasion. Put the date and time in your diary now – more details later.

In the circumstances, we are glad that work is about to start soon on the much-needed renovations to the vicarage. How grateful we are that we received the grant from the diocesan Smith Trust towards this work! We are hopeful that delays caused by the shortage of trades people and escalating building costs will not cause us too much grief. Our thanks to the churchwardens for their tenacity in progressing this important project.

Parishioners are reminded that confirmed minutes of Parish Council meetings are available to read in a folder kept at the rear of the church.
