SERMON

Fr Matthew Healy

THE NICENE-CONSTANTINOPLE CREED

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church. **We believe in one God**.

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.
