

WELCOME

ADMISSION OF CANDIDATE

There is one Body and one Spirit; there is one hope in God's call to us.

One Lord, one Faith, one Baptism, **one God and Father of all.**

Baptism is the gift of our Lord Jesus Christ. When he had risen from the dead, he commanded his followers to go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. We have come together today to obey that command.

Baptism with water signifies the cleansing from sin that Jesus' death makes possible, and the new life that God gives us through the Holy Spirit. In baptism, the promises of God are visibly signed and sealed for us. We are joined to Christ, and made members of his body, the Church universal.

Children are baptised in response to God's all-embracing love. Parents and godparents who have responded to that love come now to bring their children for baptism. Before this congregation they must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up their children in the faith and practice of the Church. In due time these children should make their own response to God, and be prepared for confirmation.

POSTLUDE

ST BART'S VICARAGE RENOVATION APPEAL



The last major capital expenditure on St Bart's Vicarage was in 1990, some thirty-two years ago. That work has proven long lasting in conjunction with some updating of areas in the house over the past 10 years, including: a new kitchen, areas with new flooring, renovated ensuite shower, new carport, paving, and new back garden. (Post-graduation gathering: Fr Matthew, Dr Asquith, and Dr Porter) On Wednesday evening on 19 October 2022, Alison Asquith was a admitted as a Doctor of Philosophy during a Graduation Ceremony at Deakin University, Geelong Waterfront Campus. Our own Dr Muriel Porter, together with sociologist, Professor Andrew Singleton, were the two examiners. The Thesis, entitled 'Anglican Encounters with Orthodox Icons', explored how Anglicans in Melbourne incorporate Orthodox Christian icons into their everyday religious practice. Drawing on in-depth interviews with fifteen people, the study discovers how and why Anglican worshippers use Orthodox icons in their devotional lives and identifies the socio-cultural background factors that produce this interest.

And Parish Council members felt quite emotional, as the fact of his leaving us very soon sank in. His reminiscences of his first years in the parish, including of some wonderful former parishioners, lightened the mood!

Appropriately, the meeting concluded with a unanimous motion of gratitude to Fr Matthew: That Parish Council records its deep gratitude to Fr Matthew Healy for his ministry to St Bart's over these past 12 and a half years. In particular, we thank him for his inspiring spiritual leadership, his vision, and his wonderful sense of humour.

Parish Council also recorded a motion of thanksgiving for the life and ministry of the late Mother Helen Granowski, who died on 9 September. Dr Granowski served St Bart's over many years as both bellringer and associate priest. It was noted that her presence in the parish, and her warm relationships with parishioners, at a time of controversy over the ordination of women, had been transformative. May she rest in peace and rise in glory. The Parish Council also had some very good news. The parish's anonymous benefactor has given the parish a further \$10,000 to help with the renovation now underway at the vicarage. This was most gratefully received.

That the work is now underway is because of the tenacity of the churchwardens in progressing negotiations with tradespeople at a time when there is both a shortage of materials and workers. A contract is now in place for the major work. And Jonathon Harrison and Don Heath have untaken some initial removal of partitions in preparation for the work. Parishioners are reminded that confirmed minutes of Parish Council meetings are available to read in a folder kept at the rear of the church.
