THE WORD

FIRST READING

With righteousness he shall judge the poor.

A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

On that day: a shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.

His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins. The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den. They will not hurt or destroy on my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea. On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'"

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, John said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? "Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. "I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

THE CREED

During the Offertory Hymn the altar is prepared. Gifts of bread, wine and the collection are gathered and brought to the front of the church. At the end of the hymn, the celebrant invites all present to prayer.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise. All glory and honour, be yours now and always, mighty Creator, everliving God. We give you thanks and praise for your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, who was looked for by the prophets, heralded by the Baptist, announced by an angel, born of the Virgin Mary, and revealed at last to men and women of every race. By his death on the cross and rising to new life, he offered the one true sacrifice for sin and obtained an eternal deliverance for his people. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:



And now, Father, we pray that we who receive these your gifts of bread and wine according to our Saviour's word may be partakers of his Body and Blood.

The Celebrant takes the bread in his hands and says:

For on the night he was betrayed he took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, his almighty Father, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'TAKE, EAT. THIS IS MY BODY WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU. DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.'

The Celebrant takes the cup in his hands and says:

After supper, he took the cup and again giving you thanks he gave it to his disciples, saying, 'DRINK FROM THIS ALL OF YOU. THIS IS MY BLOOD OF THE NEW COVENANT WHICH IS SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE REMISSION OF SINS. DO THIS, AS OFTEN AS YOU DRINK IT, IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.'

St Bart's Vicarage Renovation Appeal



The last major capital expenditure on St Bart's Vicarage was in 1990, some 32 years ago. house that require attention to maintain a reasonable living standard, including: a new family bathroom, new flooring, back veranda work and a complete interior redecorating. We won't be able to achieve it all at once but we do need to get the major items fixed as a matter of urgency so to house an additional priest in 2023. Dear Friends of St. Bart's,

The coming of Christ and the end of the world that the early Christians looked for didn't happen. Nor did the year 1000 (or was it January 1, 1001?) usher in the New Age. Neither, do I think, will 2023 – nor the year after for that matter bring about 'the end'. Adventism of every kind is a gross presumption. The world remains the same old world. The slave-holding society of the Roman Empire in Christ's own day gave way to the feudal world of the 11th century and that gave way to other things – until our own day, with all the threats and promises of Economic Irrationalism.

There is no Utopia, never has been, never will be. That is not what Advent is about, nor is it what *'the Coming of the Lord'* is about. What Advent proclaims is the openness of God to humanity and, more importantly, the openness of God to you and me personally. Salvation doesn't happen in isolation; it is the whole of humanity that is redeemed. As individuals we are offered the free gift of eternal life in Christ *in the Church*. The Kingdom of God has come: it is the task of the Church to make known this Good News.

Although we are to live in this world and identify with all the good that is in the world, we are nevertheless to live as though the Kingdom has already come. The world has its rules and its natural order. The Kingdom also has its rule and its supernatural order. Today's readings help our reflection on this great mystery.

FESTIVAL OF LESSONS & CAROLS – DON'T MISS IT!



Lots of your Favourite Carols on Wednesday evening, 21st December, at 7.30pm. Sing your heart out. **But be seated early!** Followed by drinks in the Guild Room. **Bring a plate of nibbles.** Thirty years to the day since the first women priests were ordained in St Paul's Cathedral, Melbourne, the Cathedral will host a Eucharist at 6pm on Tuesday, 13 December, to celebrate this significant anniversary.

Archbishop Kay Goldsworthy AO, Archbishop of Perth – Australia's first woman bishop – will preach at the service, at which Bishop Kate Prowd will preside.

Icons as a Guide to Advent – Dr Alison Asquith

Continuing with last week's theme of Icons as a Guide to Advent, the previous Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams' books on understanding and praying with icons suggest that the Icon known as the **Hodegetria** (or She who shows the way) on the front cover is worthy of contemplation for the Second Week in Advent. It is one of many styles that depict the Mother of God.

It is a simple representation of the Christ child who sits cradled by his mother's left arm while she points to him with her right. In most versions, his eyes are on her, and he sometimes has a hand raised in blessing.
