

A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans.



GOSPEL

Matthew 1: 18 – 24

Jesus was born of Mary, who was engaged to Joseph, son of David.

▲ A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew. Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

SERMON Fr Graeme Brennan

THE CREED

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church.

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the Resurrection of the dead, and the \blacksquare life of the world to come. Amen.

The Lord be with you. And also with you.


Lift up your hearts


Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:


As our Saviour has taught us, we are confident to pray:

St Bart's Vicarage Renovation Appeal




The last major capital expenditure on St Bart's Vicarage was in 1990, some 32 years ago. That work has proven long-lasting in conjunction with some updating of areas in the house over the past 10 years, including: a new kitchen, areas with new flooring, renovated ensuite shower, new carport, paving, and new back garden. There are now other areas of the house that require

attention to maintain a reasonable living standard, including: a new family bathroom, new flooring, back veranda work and a complete interior redecorating. We won't be able to achieve it all at once but we do need to get the major items fixed as a matter of urgency so to house an additional priest in 2023. From the Climate Action Group

The Climate Council's recent webinar entitled *Summer of Extremes: Changing Hearts and Minds in a Changing Climate* can be accessed on YouTube and I would highly recommend it.



Based on their report, *The Great Deluge: Australia's New Era of Unnatural Disasters,* it refers to Australia's 'decade in the wilderness' and how we are on the 'highway to climate hell'.

Powerful language and quite Biblical in some ways! But the big change in public opinion also gives hope if we can move fast enough.

One Chat questioner asked, 'I know a lot of people who believe in Climate Change but I don't feel they know how big a deal it is' and asked 'how do I talk to them about it without badgering them'.

Dinah Arendt, Head of Strategic Communication at the CC gave a great answer. (It's right at the end of the recording and worth waiting for!) In summary, the two most important things we can do is:

- 1. Be active voters;
- 2. Talk to your friends and family. 'You are one of the most important messengers'.

So, as with sharing our faith, we have a challenge!

By the way, for local climate action news in Yarra it is worth subscribing to the free e-Environment News. On the Yarra City Council website, search '*Take Climate Action*' then scroll down (*and keep scrolling*). There is much to talk about on their website.

Dear Friends of St. Bart's,

In anticipation – a happy and holy Christmas to you all. It is an extraordinary thing that the moment we get to Christmas Day, we seem to forget Christmas. There used to be the Twelve Days of Christmas with a lot of sharing and feasting and caring throughout. In an earlier age, the Alms Box was opened and alms given to the poor on the Feast of Stephen – hence the name 'Boxing Day'. The tree was left adorned until Epiphany – 'Green, green, green all a-green, all a-green; A-dancing round the Tree' – the tree being a hawthorn, in the old English belief that a hawthorn tree on a knoll marked the entrance to the 'other world' and a symbol of Christ. (It might be a lovely idea if a hawthorn tree could be planted in the church garden symbolically, say, near the main entrance.) Twelfth Night used to be a great party time. Remember Shakespeare's tale?

In some parts of the world, the 12 days of Christmas are still a time for visiting friends and relatives, for telling stories and wishing others well.

But the moment we get to Christmas Day, the carols and songs seem to cease. The endless barrage of tinkling muzac that assaults us from every quarter in our department stores suddenly reverts to another sound altogether. The radio stations, too, can't get back to secular music quickly enough it seems.

Even *here* at St. Bart's, we make the concession of having our Festival of Christmas Lessons and Carols (at 7.30pm) on the Wednesday *before* Christmas instead of keeping it as it should properly be kept on the Sunday *after* Christmas – right in the middle (*as it were*) of Christmastide. In either event, it is vitally important that we make a space about us this Christmas – time for reflection – time for thanksgiving – time for friendly visitors.

To those parishioners who will be away from the parish during this holy season – take care and God bless you. And God bless you too, who **will** be here.

Eventually, as love lay in scratchy hay on a manger in a meagre barn in Bethlehem all your love God, was robed in the delicate skin of a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes.

What we hope for now is that those who meet us may see, as we have, Jesus involved with us, of his looking at us, clinging untidily to us, quietly working, and speaking in us. Imagining Mary in words and pictures over the last three weeks has been one of the most powerful ways of imagining the Church, and thus we imagine ourselves in a fresh light.

As Rowan Williams* suggests, 'may we help others to imagine and . . . encounter the child of Mary as we go about our business of discipleship'.
