
Lift up your hearts

The Celebrant takes the bread and says:







Blessing of restored banners

Today we are blessing two of our banners which have been restored through the generosity of Mr Kim Ricketts, parishioner. The CEBS/Saint Bartholomew banner is in memory of Kim's mother Winifred Anne (Nan) Ricketts and the Blessed Sacrament banner is in memory of his father William Frederick (Fred) Ricketts. Kim's mother was a seamstress by profession, so Kim felt it was appropriate that the CEBS banner should be restored in her memory, as it is a fine example of this sort of work almost certainly done by a woman. The Blessed Sacrament banner was restored in memory of Kim's father, whose background was Anglo-Catholic. In fact, all of Fred's family were devout Anglo-Catholics, especially his sisters, and that side of the family remains to this day devoted Anglo-Catholic church goers. The restoration was done by Grimwade Restoration Services, who also do work for the National Gallery of Victoria. Our sincere thanks to Kim.

ACTING VICAR'S LETTER



In my Letter last week I wrote about the wonderful blessing that the singing of the Sunday psalm is to us. Sometimes we tend to let the music wash over us and not listen closely to the psalm's words, but these words can offer us deep understandings about both God and human nature.

Today's Psalm 103 is a good example of this. It is classified as an Individual Psalm of Thanksgiving, meaning that it is a psalm in which an individual person praises God for his goodness to them, usually for deliverance from some difficult situation. In ancient Israel, the person who composed the psalm came to a sacred ceremony, often in the Jerusalem Temple, and at a certain point, offered the psalm as a song to express their heartfelt thanks. This meant that everyone present on that day would be hearing an original song of praise (or thanksgiving or lament, depending on the psalm) to God.

Psalm 103 outlines in detail what God has done and continues to do for the psalmist. God forgives iniquity (that is, their very bad or immoral behaviour), heals diseases, redeems from the Pit (a reference to death), crowns with steadfast love and mercy, satisfies with good, and works justice for them and all those who are oppressed.

The word translated as 'mercy' in verse 4 of the psalm is interesting. It comes from the Hebrew verbal root *raham* and particularly its noun form *rehem*, meaning 'womb'. The psalm in its original Hebrew is making it clear that God's mercy and compassion is closely tied to the concept of what the Jewish people called 'womb love', that is, the love a mother feels for the unborn child in her womb. This gives us a strong sense of how caring and gentle the love of God and the mercy he shows is for each of us. It is also a strong feminine image of God, and a counterbalance to the old and now outdated view that the God of the Hebrew Scriptures (the Old Testament) is harsh and unforgiving. We are able to experience a mother's love from God. Twenty-two of the psalms remember and call upon God's mercy, that is, upon God's 'womb love'.

Verse 13 of Psalm 103, which is not in today's portion, likens the love of God also to the tender love of a father for his children. This means that in Psalm 103 we have images of the love of God for us which is like that of both a mother and a father. When times are difficult for us, these are marvellous and strong images we can call up for reassurance.
