





Matthew 20: 1-16

Are you envious because I am generous?

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples.

"The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. After agreeing with the labourers for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard.

"When he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the marketplace; and he said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.' So they went. When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, 'Why are you standing here idle all day?' They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard.' "When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, 'Call the labourers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first.' When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage.

Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual daily wage. And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.'

"But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?' So the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Sermon

The Creed

he offered the one true sacrifice for sin


and obtained an eternal deliverance for his people.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying, 'DRINK THIS, ALL OF YOU; THIS IS MY BLOOD OF THE NEW COVENANT WHICH IS SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS, AS OFTEN AS YOU DRINK IT, IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.' Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

bring us to the joy of your eternal kingdom


with all the company of the redeemed.


The Lord's Prayer

Parish Council report to the Parish September 2023

The main item on this month's Parish Council meeting agenda was of course the Institution of our new Vicar, Fr Stuart Soley. Planning has been ongoing for months, but now, with the event just two weeks ago, we were down to finalising inevitable small details. We believe it is going to be a wonderful occasion for the whole parish.

It was also the last Parish Council meeting for almost a year to be chaired by an acting vicar, so we took the opportunity to move a motion of thanks to Fr Walter for his ministry with us since March.

We heard an update on the parish's compliance with the Diocese's child safety requirements. Muriel Porter has been appointed the Child Safety Officer, taking over from Jonathon Harrison, who is more than happy to relinquish this administrative role. Our thanks to Jonathon for his work in this area.

Parish Council has identified a number of areas that need firm policies to be established once Fr Stuart is in place. They are: use of the sacristy, the parish office, and the photocopier; and procedures for welcomers, and the counting and banking of the offertory. Also important is developing a code of conduct for the parish, which has been recommended to the churchwardens by Kooyoora, the Diocese's Professional Standards body, with whom they had to be in contact recently.

Parishioners are reminded that confirmed Parish Council minutes are available for reading at the back of the church.

St Bart's Climate Action Group

Two of us recently attended a Public Meeting organized by ARRCC (*Australian Religious Response to Climate Change*) in the Stonnington Uniting Church, East Malvern.

We heard speakers from the Jewish, Christian, Islamic and Buddhist communities explain how specific teachings of their traditions had encouraged them personally to join in combined action to encourage our leaders to take urgent steps to counteract the warming of the planet.

Plans were then outlined for the group to work for a complete move away from the use of fossil fuels, especially as the next federal election draws near.

Members of the committee explained that ARRCC was in no way party politically aligned, but concerned only to put pressure on all candidates for public office to take climate issues very seriously. *Fr. Jim Brady*
