





Sermon

The Creed


God of holy dreaming, Great Creator Spirit, from the dawn of creation you have given your children the good things of Mother Earth.

DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.'


The celebrant takes the cup and says:





'God of Holy Dreaming'

The Preface to the Great Thanksgiving prayer used today came to the 1995 A Prayer Book for Australia from Aboriginal Anglican leader, Lenore Parker, a Yaegl elder and now a priest in the Diocese of Grafton. She offered these words spontaneously at a meeting of the former General Synod Women's Commission in the early 1990s, when the new prayer book was being developed.
