#### **SYNOD**

This year's Synod of the Diocese of Melbourne followed the election of new representatives earlier this year. Various elections were held to many of the key diocesan

bodies, including the election of a Board of Nominators whose task it will be to put forwards names of people they believe are being called to be the next Archbishop after Archbishop Freier retires in about 18 months' time. Our two able lay representatives, Ann Brady and Muriel Porter, together with Bishop Alison Taylor and I will share some reflections on the synod during morning tea today.







#### The Creed



This is my blood of the new covenant shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'


Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:







### **PARISH NEWS**

#### **Richmond Churches Food Centre**

The client numbers are increasing at the Food Centre and people are queueing up to an hour before opening time, with up to 78 receiving food packs each week. Small family packs and baby food are being distributed to the Uniting Kindergarten and 100 lunch packs and a few family packs to Richmond High School each month.

This is a clear indication of the growing need for food support in the local community. Family packs are now also being distributed on Fridays from the Centre. Clients are enjoying morning tea when they visit the Centre on Mondays, particularly the opportunity tosocialise with others.

It is pleasing to report that the offertory collected for the Food Centre at Fr Stuart's Institution was \$813.00. The parish will make this amount up to \$1,200 as a donation to the Food Centre. Please continue to support the food collection at the back of the church, particularly with protein foods listed on the porch notice board, as this helps to defray costs of purchasing food.

The Centre is planning a Christmas Day event for the clients, and a Christmas barbeque has been suggested rather than a traditional meal. Rabbi Gabi from the Ark Centre has kindly made their kitchen available for food preparation and offered volunteers from their congregation.

There will be a call for volunteers from participating churches to serve food at the lunch on Christmas day. Please consider volunteering if possible.

#### Parish Council Report to the Parish October 2023

The main business this month, after welcoming our new vicar as chair of his first St Bart's Parish Council meeting, was to confirm the date of this year's Annual Meeting.

It will be held following mass on Sunday 19 November.

The immediate matters to be attended to leading up to the meeting are Electoral Roll revision and reports from parish groups.

First, Electoral Roll revision. The formal notice about the revision is on the church notice board. The current electoral roll is available for you to check your entry. Any changes, and applications for new enrolment, must be made on the prescribed form, copies of which are available, and be submitted to the Vicar by 5pm on Saturday 4 November.

Second, reports from the churchwardens, the Parish Council and parish groups must be submitted by Sunday 5 November to murielporter5"a"gmail.com. The reports will be available for parishioners on Sunday 12 November.

Parish Council reflected on the happy occasion of Fr Stuart's Institution service, noting some very warm feedback on both the liturgy and the refreshments. We were pleased that the offertory collection at the service for the Richmond Churches Food Centre totalled \$813, an amount which Parish Council decided to increase to \$1200, given the high level of food insecurity in Richmond at present. Trevor Blake's excellent photographic record of the event will be shared in various ways and securely archived for posterity.

We also completed work on a policy regarding the sacristy, and continued developing parish policies in other areas. Parishioners are reminded that confirmed Parish Council minutes are available for reading at the back of the church.
