



we may recognise him as the firstborn

We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord,
who is one with you and the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD


FIRST READING

The response at the end of the reading is:

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

The cantor sings the psalm, and the congregation repeats the response and then joins in the response throughout the psalm.



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The Lord's is the earth and its fullness, the world and all its peoples.

It is God who set it on the seas; on the waters God made it firm.

Who shall climb the mountain of the Lord?
Who shall stand in God's holy place?
Those with clean hands and pure heart,
who desire not worthless things.

They shall receive blessings from the Lord and reward from the God who saves them. These are the ones who seek God, seek the face of the God of Jacob.

SECOND READING

The response at the end of the reading is:

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

We stand to welcome the gospel.

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

We repeat the acclamation after the cantor and again after the sentence reflecting the theme of the gospel:

Come to me, all you that are weary and heavy burdened, and I will give you rest, says the Lord.

After the end of the Gospel, the reader says:

The Gospel of the Lord, praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Fr Stuart will introduce the Litany with special intentions.


Then the Litany will be led by the cantor.

During the offertory hymn, the gifts of bread and wine are brought to the sanctuary and the altar is prepared. The altar and the priest are censed.

The thurifer comes into the nave to cense the whole assembly.

PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS

The priest recites the prayer over the gifts, and we respond:

God our provider,

you give the one bread and one cup to feed us, and one strong hope to sustain us.


Make us one with all your saints

in the fullness of Christ's body, so that we may rise again to glory with him who is Lord for ever and ever.



The Prayer continues


After the elevation of the Host and the elevation of the Chalice, all may bow with the priest in adoration of real presence of Christ. and all join in singing the Acclamation:

Amen.


THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND THE COMMUNION

ICON OF ALL SAINTS

About the icon on the front of today's Mass Book

In the icon on the cover of today's Mass Book and Parish News, the setting is Paradise, identifiable by the abundance of green trees and shrubbery. Green, the colour of leaves in springtime speaks of life and growth (Martin 2002). In the bottom left of the icon is Abraham holding a human soul to his chest: the bosom of Abraham is a name given to the place where the righteous dead rest until Judgement Day (Luke 16: 19-31). To the right of the icon is Jacob holding the 'twelve tribes' in a cloth, while in the centre is Dismas the penitent thief who was told by Christ on the cross that 'this day you will be with me in paradise' (Luke 23: 39-43).

Central to the icon is the great 'cloud of witnesses' described by St Paul in his letter to the Hebrews (11:33-12:2). The saints are gathered around Christ who is depicted as crowned and seated in glory. Beneath him is the Throne of Preparation before which Adam and Eve prostrate themselves. At the top of the icon is the cross. To the top left is King David and to the top right is King Solomon.

The saints themselves are gathered into ranks according to their 'type': martyrs with martyrs, ascetics with ascetics, holy fathers with holy fathers, Apostles with Apostles. Some saints are recognizable, but the idea is always that the number of saints present is beyond counting as told by John in the book of Revelation:

I looked, and ... a great multitude which no one could number, of all nations, tribes, peoples, and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb ... saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne" (Rev 7:9-11).

This icon shows the communion of saints; in communion with each other and with God (Forest 2014). Today's icon of All Saints shows an 'organized' hierarchy of saints in heaven. It gives the impression of a completed heaven, like a heavenly temple with Christ reigning over everything. While the circle is a perfect shape and does not look unfinished, there is the potential for the circle to grow larger; to encompass yet more souls and bring them into the heavenly realm.

The icon reminds us of the Last Judgement in many details, yet also reminds us that there is still room for us.

As with all icons, this icon can move us to prayer as it is a window into the divine. For many of us this can be difficult to understand: how to contemplate an icon, the foreign style of the figures, the strange perspective. The complex array of symbolism can at times be overwhelming. However, all icons are meant to be simple entrances into prayer. They help us to contemplate the essential things of being, holiness, virtue, and worship of God.




