THE LITURGICAL ENVIRONMENT

The liturgical colour for the Third Sunday of Lent is rose. The colour rose indicates joy amid a time marked by prayer and penitence. Today is sometimes known as *Laetare* Sunday – *Laetare* is one of the Latin words for rejoice. It comes from the entrance antiphon for today's Mass 'Rejoice, Jerusalem! Come together, you who love her.'

FROM FR STUART:

JUST OVER HALFWAY TO EASTER

Even though many talk of the Fourth Sunday in Lent as the halfway point to Easter – it isn't really – it is more like just over halfway!



Regardless of the exactness of the count of days, it is worth taking stock of our destination. This season of grace in which we seek to become better at the three things on the front of this Mass Book – it has a purpose – to live our baptismal life more fully which is something we renew at Easter.

What does living our baptismal life more fully mean?

I think it is embodied in the questions and answers that make up the renewal of baptismal vows at the Easter Vigil. They 'flesh out' what it means to live as a follower of Jesus Christ – in shorthand – to live the Christian life.

So, I have printed these promises which we will make around the font at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday, on page 21 of this booklet. I commend them to your prayers and reflection in the three weeks between now and the Paschal Triduum.

GETTING READY FOR EASTER

There is always a lot to do to prepare for the celebration of the Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. There are a list of a few ways in which you can assist listed on page 20.

DR MURIEL PORTER, LAY READER

Our Honorary Lay Reader, Dr Muriel Porter, is licensed by the archbishop on the nomination of the Parish Priest and with the support and concurrence of the Parish Council. Muriel was so licensed in 2020 by Fr Matthew and now I am nominating her for a new term of five years. My nomination goes to the next meeting of the Parish Council next Monday, but I wanted you to know how glad I am to so nominate her. Muriel shares many gifts generously with the parish and this role also enables her to exercise her gifts of preaching and assisting in the sanctuary amongst other ministries.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

One of the great devotions of the Christian church is the Stations of the Cross. I will be leading a simple form of this devotion in the church this coming Friday evening, 15 March, at 6.30 pm.

On Good Friday there will be an ecumenical celebration of the Stations of the Cross. It has been the custom of the churches in Richmond to pray these through the streets on Good Friday. These ecumenical stations of the cross will begin at 10.30 am – more details soon. If you would like to join us – please let me know so we can make sure you have a booklet ready for the devotional walk.

PROMPT TO PRAYER ON THE GO

Many of you have commented about how you liked my inclusion of Pope Francis' list of ways to 'fast' in Lent. These fasts were not of food but other ways to change behaviour as a Lenten discipline.

Recently I heard how Pope Francis teaches people to pray.

This '5 Finger Prayer' is a simple way to make sure we pray for all people and not just ourselves.

It is worth using this method.

REST IN PEACE FR TONY

This week I learnt of the death of one of my teachers of theology. Fr Tony Kelly is an Australian Catholic priest in the Redemptorist religious order. A prolific author, composer of hymns and imaginative and creative thinker, Tony had a profound effect on my learning. May he rest in peace.





THE LITURGY OF THE WORD


FIRST READING

The cantor sings the psalm, and the congregation repeats the response and then joins in the response throughout the psalm.

The response at the end of the reading is:



THE HOMILY

THE APOSTLES' CREED

We stand for the creed which is said by all.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

We remain standing.
The response to the petitions are:

Lord, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

The response after the prayers for the departed is:

Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord.And let light perpetual shine upon them.

and concludes with this prayer:

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

THE GREETING OF PEACE

The priest introduces the Greeting of Peace and then says:

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

THE PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS AND THE CENSING

While the gifts of bread and wine are brought to the sanctuary and the altar is prepared we sing the hymn. The altar and the priest are censed.

The thurifer comes into the nave to cense the whole assembly


PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS


