

INTRODUCTION:

Our Scripture readings today contain a level of tension: between the difficult implications of faithfulness to God and yet the joy and fullness of life which flow from it. In the reading from Joel, God promises prosperity and abundance, removing the shame that Israel has known in the past. In 2 Timothy, Paul's life is drawing to an end. He knows he has been faithful to his calling and that God will reward him. At the same time he is aware of his past sufferings and, at times, loneliness, though he does not doubt that God's salvation will embrace him. The Gospel reading presents the demand to surrender everything in order to follow Jesus. It seems a hard calling but promises rich rewards and full community life with others in God's kingdom.



THE GOSPEL (Luke 18:15-30)

A reading from the Gospel according to St Luke **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

People were bringing even infants to him that he might touch them, and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it. But Jesus called for them and said, "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." A certain ruler asked Jesus, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not commit adultery. You shall not murder. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness. Honour your father and mother." He replied, "I have kept all these since my youth." When Jesus heard this, he said to him, "There is still one thing lacking. Sell all that you own and distribute the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."But when he heard this, he became sad, for he was very rich. Jesus looked at him and said, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God! Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." Those who heard it said, "Then who can be saved?" He replied, "What is impossible for mortals is possible for God." Then Peter said, "Look, we have left our homes and followed you." And he said to them, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or wife or brothers and sisters or parents or children for the sake of the kingdom of God who will not get back very much more in this age and in the age to come eternal life."
